

Diet system in the Czech Republic

What is diet? Hospital diet is a meal that has therapeutic effects, it is part of the treatment. Diets are prescribed by doctors and planned by a nutritional therapist based on a patient's disease.

The types of hospital diet

In the Czech Republic diet system is divided into 3 groups:
basic diets, special diets and standardized diets.

BASIC DIETS

Most patients are getting one of basic diets. They are numbered from 0 to 13.

0 – FULL LIQUID DIET

Indication: for patients after surgery in oral cavity or oesophagus disease.

1 – SOFT DIET

Indication: after gastrointestinal diseases and surgery or oesophageal cancer

2 – BLAND DIET

Indication: for patients with long-term gastrointestinal diseases (especially stomach)

3 – REGULAR DIET

Indication: for patients without dietary restrictions.

4 – FAT - RESTRICTED DIET

Indication: This diet are prescribed for chronic pancreatitis, gallbladder or liver diseases

5 - LOW - RESIDUE (FIBER) DIET

Indication: for patients with diarrhea, inflammatory bowel disease (Crohn's disease or ulcerative colitis)

6 - LOW - PROTEIN DIET (RENAL DIET)

Indication: a low - protein diet is simply a diet that has been prescribed for someone with kidney disease.

7 - LOW - CHOLESTEROL DIET

Indication: This diet is designed to reduce cholesterol blood levels. After heart attack or stroke.

8 - REDUCING DIET

Indication: for obese patients or sometimes for overweight patients with 2 type diabetes

9 - DIABETIC DIET

Indication: A diabetic diet is a diet that is used by people with diabetes mellitus 1 or 2 type or high blood glucose. They eat 6 meals a day. The diabetic patients have a ***second dinner*** (especially fruits or vegetables).

10 - SALT - RESTRICTED DIET

Indication: salt - restricted diet is usually prescribed for patients with high blood pressure, edema and blood vessel disease

11 - NUTRITIOUS DIET

Indication: for patients suffering from cancer, realimentation after infections (tuberculosis), ***2nd dinner!***

12 - DIET FOR TODDLERS

Indication: diet used for toddlers (1- 3 years)

12b - Diet for infants (0 -12 months)

13 - DIET FOR OLDER CHILDREN

Indication: for children without dietary restriction (4 -14 years.)

SPECIAL DIETS

OS - Tea diet – The patient can slowly drink tea after 2 hours after surgery or one day after surgery in the digestive tract.

(It is important that patients do not drink until they are fully awake to avoid choking.)

4S - Very low - fat diet – diet after gallbladder attack and surgery

STANDARDIZED DIETS

Pancreatitis diet – diet after **NPO (nothing per mouth)** in acute stage of pancreatitis (1-8 days). BUT Amylase level in the blood must be in norm.

Gluten - free diet – for patients with coeliac disease or non-coeliac gluten sensitivity

Lactose (or dairy) - free diet – for patients suffering from lactose intolerance or dairy allergy. (*Difference between lactose intolerance and a diary allergy is that most patients find they are able to tolerate some level of lactose*)

DRINKING REGIME

Drinking regime (which include sweet and bitter hot tea or still water) is provided on wards for all day. Type of tea depends on a patient's disease.

Curative teas

They must be unsweetened and always freshly prepared!

Urological tea – tea for patients with cystitis (an inflammation of the urinary bladder)

Camomile tea – tea, which is useful in treating anxiety, insomnia, gum disease or after otorhinolaryngology surgery

SERVING

Preparation and transit

In the Czech Republic we use a thermo tray system. The individual meals are plated onto heated porcelain plates and bowls with number of diet and patient's name. After placed into the individual stainless steel ward trolleys to be wheeled to the different wards.

Serving

Most patients have 4 (breakfast, lunch, snack, dinner) meals a day. Some of them have second dinner (diabetics). Diets are served from trolley by nurse. Bedridden patient is feed by a nurse or nursing assistant.

Hygienic rules

Nurse in a hospital have to follow some hygiene rules:

She wears clean protective clothing, such as a disposable apron.

She washes and dry her hands thoroughly before serving meals, and wash and dry them again frequently during work.

FINANCING

On the one hand, patients with regular diet have not choice from menu in hospital, but on the other hand financials budgets for all-day meals for patients are paid by the insurance company.

How much does it cost? For example:


Regular diet- 64 CZK without **VAT (value added tax)** = 2,4 EUR

Diabetic diet- 68 CZK without VAT = 2,6 EUR





Hospital diets

Different hospital diets

- Enhanced diet, if the patient has no appetite or he/she has risk of malnutrition. The energy of enhanced diet is 1800 to 2700 kilocalories.
- Vegetarian food
- Liquid food if the patient can't bite and swallow normal food.
- Soft food meals, if the patient can't bite normal food.
- Lactose free diet meals, that the patient can't eat lactose-containing foods.
- Food allergy diet
- Celiac disease diet








In Finnish hospital



- In Finnish hospitals, patients are offered food five times a day.
- Breakfast, lunch, coffee, dinner and evening meal.
- Patients will be offered a normal meal if they don't have any diets. But they can choose what they want to drink and what bread to eat at the meal.
- The average salary of a Finn is about 3,386€/month (208,17 Δεν / 86,55 Kč)
- The food patients eat costs 20,17€/day (1242,70Δεν / 515,49Kč) But if the patient has a diet the food costs 30,23€/day (1858,39Δεν / 772,74Kč)
- The patient costs to the hospital 48,90€/day (3008,41Δεν / 1249,98Kč)



- The food comes from the central kitchen to the ward in a heated trolley and it is pre-dispensed on plates.
- Department assistants help practical nurses and nurses with food distribution in the hospital.
- When you start sharing food you need to wash and disinfect your hands. You don't need to wear protective gloves or an apron if you don't want to. But if you use protective gloves, you must change them when you go to a new patient.
- You need to check to the list what food the patient can eat and which diet he or she is following.
- After you have taken the food to the patient, then disinfect your hands.
- If the patient is a bed patient, practical nurses will help him/her in eating.

Diet system in our country




Meals offered to patients inside the hospital are part of their overall care for recovery. Obviously, this food should be safe and of a good quality. Our local hospital has five different diets:

- General food
- Light food
- Diet without salt
- Diet for diabetic patients
- Diet for patients with hepatitis

- General food- for patients that don't have any diet restrictions.
- Light food- for patients who had surgery. They receive this kind of food in the postoperative period.
- Diet without salt- for patients who have acute kidney inflammation or glomerulonephritis acuta. Basic principles of this diet are: no salt, protein and water restriction. Patients can eat unsalted bread, rice, biscuits, cooked potatoes, jam.
- Diet for patients with hepatitis- for patients with Hepatitis type A. Food is prepared by boiling and pureeing the products. Patients can eat milk, yoghurt, boiled eggs, fish, fresh fruit, vegetables, honey, vegetable soup.
- Diet for diabetic patients- food mustn't contain any concentrated sugars.




**How many times a day do

Patients have three meals-breakfast, lunch and dinner. They eat some snacks in the meantime.



**How is fluid intake ensured?
What do patients get?**



Patients receive tea or yoghurt with their meal- usually with the breakfast. They also get some kind of fruit compete. They get other fluids from their family and friends. We advise the patients to stay hydrated and for that reason they drink water and juices throughout the day.



pay 300 denars (around 5€)




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Average salary in our country is variable, but in this moment is around 400 €


Do patients have to pay for food in hospitals?

Every patient has to pay for the meals, and part of the price is paid by the patient and the other part is covered by the Health Insurance Fund Of Republic N. Macedonia.

Can patients without any diet restriction choose what to eat in a hospital?



Patients can't choose what kind of food they want to eat because there aren't any special menu choices. Family and friends sometimes bring them food. They usually bring pretzels, biscuits, fresh and dried fruit or some other treats like cookies or sweets.



How is food served?



The food is served in foam food containers. Hospital caterers deliver the food to the ward in catering sized portions in a trolley and before serving, meals are getting heated.

Hospital caterers always wear uniform and gloves while serving the food.

**Who feeds the patients
confined to bed?**



- In cases where the patient has a functional challenge, immobility as a result of stroke, paralyze, dementia, the nurse helps the patient to eat. Feeding assistance is time-consuming activity and the staff should respect the patient's dignity and emotions in addition to food intake, so the nurse feeds every patient patiently. Sometimes immobile patients are fed by a family member.
- Mobile patients are usually able to feed themselves without any help of someone else.



In each room there are tables and mobile patients usually eat there.

Since there aren't any special menu's patients can't choose, so those who are without restrictions eat general food.



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

Other related questions

- How to ensure/control the intake of liquids?
 - 1'5 liter of mineral water use to be given to patients daily. This way, nursing assistants can perform part of the control and encourage the patient to drink more, if necessary
- What kind of fluids are offered and how often?
 - 1'5 l of mineral water/patient/day, plus white coffee or tea, plus fruit juices can be given in different times (breakfast, in the middle of the morning, snack, before sleep, or even on request)

Other related questions

- How meals are served?
- Meals are delivered to wards by the kitchen staff
- Who serves it?
- Nursing assistants are in charge of serving them to patients
- Who feeds bedridden patients?
- Helping feeding to patients with difficulties is another typical task entrusted to nursing assistants



Other related questions

- Do patients have to pay for food?
 - In public hospitals, food is free
 - In private hospitals, food must be paid by
 - The patient
 - The insurance company, as a part of the hospital bill
- What is the cost per day?
 - Around 30€ (all expenses included)






Characteristics of diets


